Chartered in 1965, NAES is the only pre-collegiate educational association that is both national in scope and Episcopal in character.

Who May Join NAES?

- **Membership** is open to schools and Early Childhood Education programs owned, operated, or sponsored by a parish, cathedral, religious community, diocese, province(s), seminary, or other organization of the Episcopal Church, or those under the jurisdiction or operating with the knowledge and consent of the bishop of the diocese in which they are located.
- **Associate Membership** (non-voting) is open to school start-ups or schools not Church-related but sympathetic to the aims and purposes NAES.
- **Membership benefits** accrue to all school staff members and leaders, and to the leaders of your sponsoring entity, if your school has one.

Instructions for Calculating Your 2010-2011 NAES Dues

1. **Calculate** your school’s “2009-2010 Net Tuition Revenue.” This is the total tuition dollars you collected in 2009-2010 **not including** any fees, financial aid, merit award or tuition remission money, and room/board fees.
2. **Consult the chart below** to find your school’s corresponding 2010-2011 Dues Category and Dues Amount.
3. **Complete the reverse side of this form** by providing your “2009-2010 Net Tuition Revenue;” circling the applicable Dues Category letter; and entering the Dues Amount and the amount enclosed.
4. **Sign the required non-discrimination statement** on the reverse side of this form.
5. **Return the form** with your school’s check.
