Principal Responsibilities:

- Create a positive classroom environment which all boys feel known and valued
- Plan to deliver individual, whole-group, and small-group instruction for two sections of Chinese
- Plan and prepare lesson plans and instructional materials that facilitate active learning
- Assess student progress using a variety of formal and informal data collection tools and methods and provide student remediation as needed
- Work collaboratively with teachers at both St. Christopher's and St. Catherine's and serve as a member of the 8th grade or 9th grade faculty team
- Manage student behavior in accordance with best practices for teaching boys
- Supervise students during recess, student reading time, or during other coverages as needed
- Foster communication and a respectful partnership with parents/guardians in conferences and through written correspondence
- Engage in ongoing professional growth and development
- Attend team, faculty, and all-school professional development meetings as needed
- Attend chapel regularly

Qualifications and Key Skills:

- A minimum of three years teaching experience is preferred.

- A desire to introduce multiple perspectives and a diverse set of backgrounds as they pertain to the topics and lessons
- An ability to enhance in students qualities such as creative thinking and problem solving, technological savvy, intellectual curiosity and risk taking, research and analysis, collaboration and teamwork, and the ability to apply core knowledge to new and changing situations
- An enthusiasm for nurturing global awareness and empathy in students in each class to strengthen these two essential skills
