Position Overview. Christchurch School seeks a Humanities Teacher. This is an opportunity for an educator to join a department engaged in building a curriculum around the competencies or skills that liberal arts disciplines have traditionally taught, such as English, history, and theology. This is all done within the broader context of a school that prioritizes relationships, the use of place, and local resources to make learning relevant for a wide range of students. We value lessons that connect to real-world topics, and we provide teachers with materials and support for growing their approach to student-centered learning within the broader departmental framework.

Requirements and Qualifications.

- Qualified candidates should hold a bachelor's degree in Humanities or a related field such as English or history. Formal education training and teaching experience are desirable, as is prior coaching experience. Master's degrees are preferred.
- The person in this position will teach a normal course load of four classes.
- Candidates should be realistic and excited about the challenges and rewards of teaching and living in a boarding school. In particular, this position is also expected to coach two out of three seasons, act as an advisory to a student advisory group, and do evening and weekend duty on a rotating basis.
- Candidates should be realistic and excited about working with students who have a wide variety of learning styles and ability levels.
