Reports to: Head of School

Description

The role of the Chaplain at Palmer Trinity School is multifaceted and committed to the spiritual well-being of the entire school community. The Chaplain is instrumental in upholding the Episcopal Identity of the school and supporting the teachings and values of the Judeo-Christian perspective while recognizing the diversity of belief and practice within the school and its community. With oversight of Trinity Chapel and all related gatherings, the Chaplain plays a vital role in responding pastorally to local and global events and in offering support, prayers, and reassurance during moments of tragedy as well as celebrating important achievements/moments within the school community.

Essential Functions

- Oversee Trinity Chapel and coordinate all religious gatherings including school chapels, convocations, and sacramental events within the daily spiritual life of the school
- Teach classes within the Religious Studies, Ethics, and Philosophy Department or in an area of expertise.
- Assist with curriculum development for religious instruction in the classroom and a Character Development Program
- Serve on the school's Leadership Team
- Provide pastoral guidance, counsel, care and consultation to students, faculty, and parents
- Collaborate with the Administrative and Academic Teams in shaping program and curriculum
- Maintain a collaborative relationship with the Diocese of Southeast Florida and Episcopal schools of the Diocese attending meetings as scheduled
- Welcome people of all faiths and contribute to the Counseling Team and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Team, infusing a compassionate perspective into these essential aspects of school life
- Respond pastorally to local, national, international tragedies by composing prayers and offering reassurance and comfort as needed

- Lead the school community in important religious observance and celebration
- Develop, research, and attend professional development opportunities for faculty.
- Keep the Head of School and Division Heads informed of school and student related issues, as well as all religious events and programs
- Consult with the Head of School, Division Heads, and designated directors to plan special events in which worship is an integral aspect.
- Other duties and responsibilities assigned by the Head of School

- Fulfill expectations as outlined in the Faculty Statement of Commitment and the Palmer Trinity School Portrait of a Teacher (attached)
- Model the values of Palmer Trinity School
- Promote positive interpersonal relationships with colleagues
